1. Always dilute product properly and utilize proper protective equipment. Depending on soil buildup, dilute 1:50 (2.5 oz. per gallon) for light soil, 1:20 (6 oz. per gallon) for regular soil or 1:10 (12 oz. per gallon) for heavy soil buildup.



2. For use with auto scrubbers and other scrubbing equipment, dilute product 1:20 (6 oz. per gallon). Add defoamer to recovery tank. Rinse equipment after use.



3. For use with foam gun or pressure spray equipment dilute 1:20 (6 oz. per gallon) for regular soil and 1:10 (12 oz. per gallon) for heavy soil.
